What is an EnerGuide home evaluation?

An EnerGuide home evaluation analyzes the energy performance of your home and can be your first step in making your home more energy-efficient and more comfortable.

What will I get from an evaluation?

- a basement-to-attic evaluation of your home
- an EnerGuide rating, which is an energy efficiency score for your home
- a label that proves your home's rating
- information about your home's energy performance, how it compares to similar homes in Canada and where energy is being wasted
- advice on how to improve your home's energy efficiency

Start saving in just three steps:

- 1. Find a service organization at nrcan.gc.ca/homes.
- 2. Schedule an EnerGuide home evaluation
- 3. Make improvements based on the evaluation

Why should I get an evaluation?

Learn how your home can save you money.

An EnerGuide home evaluation will find those areas in your home where you may be wasting valuable energy and money. If you are thinking of investing in home improvements or renovations, an evaluation can help you get the most for your money. An evaluation will take the guesswork out of which upgrades would work best for your home and save you the most on utility bills.

Improve your comfort and living environment.

Improving energy efficiency by upgrading insulation, heating and cooling systems or windows can make your home more comfortable. These types of upgrades can reduce cold spots, drafts and noise and provide more even temperatures and cleaner air.
